Coming together with local community organisations and using the power of sport, the Foundation engages with thousands of people every year through programme delivery, Carrick's Boot Room campaign, and volunteering and training opportunities.



CARRICK'S STREET REDS

Delivered in partnership with Manchester United Foundation, Carrick's Street Reds is a free, evening programme that has been designed to engage young people aged 8-19 through the power of football.

Taking place at Old Trafford Sports Barn, and delivered at peak times of antisocial behaviour, participants get the chance to play, learn new skills, and gain qualifications in a supportive and positive environment.

GIRLS WITHOUT BOUNDARIES

Working in partnership with Lancashire Cricket Foundation, Girls Without Boundaries has been designed to inspire disengaged young women by building their confidence through music, dance, and workshops focusing on different life skills.

Delivered during the school term, teachers help identify students from years 7 to 11 who they believe would benefit most from the six-week course.

CARRICK'S BOOT ROOM

Launched in 2018, Carrick's Boot Room encourages people from across Greater Manchester and Tyne and Wear to donate their unwanted or outgrown football boots and Astroturf trainers, so that they can be cleaned, up-cycled, and distributed to youngsters in need.

The campaign forms part of the Foundation's commitment to ensuring that all programme participants, no matter their age, background or ability, have access to the equipment they need to take part and be the best that they can be.



The school is incredibly grateful for the football boots that were kindly donated. For some families, having the equipment to be able to play a number of sports can present a real challenge. Being able to provide children with these boots has changed the way that some children view sports and how they are involved.

CARRICK'S KICKS

Carrick's Kicks is a free football programme providing youngsters aged 8-19 with opportunities to take part in constructive activities, learn leadership skills, and complete qualifications that will support them in their future endeavours.

Being delivered in North Shields and Byker in partnership with Newcastle United Foundation, the programme strives to break down barriers between the police and young people and aims to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour in local areas.

WALLSEND BOYS CLUB

Michael Carrick Foundation has committed to support Wallsend Boys Club by providing a capacity building grant which helps capitalise on recent facility developments.

The goal is to help develop local partnerships, raise funds and secure commercial opportunities, so that the club can continue to provide a safe space where youngsters and their families have the facilities, support and inspiration to thrive.

HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT OUR WORK?

Every penny raised and donated goes directly into sustaining Michael Carrick Foundation and helps create a lasting legacy that will inspire this generation and generations to come.

THE DIFFERENCE YOUR MONEY CAN MAKE

£50 - enables the Foundation to recruit, train and deploy one young volunteer so they they can gain access to valuable work experience.

£150 - supports one young person through a Level 1 sports coaching qualification and provides them with a first step on a career pathway.

£500 - provides boxing pads, gloves and safety equipment that will allow the Foundation to teach self-defence, dance and other activities to 250 girls who are at risk of being excluded from education. This programme is vital in helping improve their health, well-being, confidence and social skills.

£1000 - the amount it costs to hire a community football venue to host a week of free football sessions for local children.

£2,500 – the cost for 10 young people to go on a residential camp to improve their team work, social skills, and build self-confidence and independence.

£4,000 - the cost to run a participant day, where youngsters from across Greater Manchester and Tyne and Wear can come together for a day of coaching, friendly competitions, lunch and life skills workshops.
